The origin

A funding crisis that nearly jeopardized the project

- 2019: Creation of the Decidim Association
- 2022:
 - Two workers paid
 - Two public grants (50k each one)
- Barcelona City Council does not pay us a grant that was due to us.
- That gives us a negative balance of 50k.


Why?


To ensure the sustainability of decidim as a digital commons

Sustainability Plan

Needs

-  Reduce dependence on public funding and diversify funding sources.
-  Achieve a stable income base in the medium to long term.
-  Overcoming the limitations of the current development model, dependent on public contracts.
-  Have a team that allows to gain operational capacity.
-  Improve external communication and storytelling.
-  Encourage participation in the community.
-  Fostering the project's alliances with its environment.

Strengthening the operational capacity of the Association's Team is an urgent necessity in order to be able to fulfil all its responsibilities, ensure sustainability and allow Decidim to grow.





Realistic scenario

- The aim is to reach a budget of around **400,000 euros** by 2026.
- With a team of **6 people** paid by the Association

Ideal scenario

- The aim is to reach a budget of around **700,000 euros by** 2026.
- With a team of **10 people** paid by the Association








Evolution in the distribution of income sources



Ideal distribution outlined in the sustainability plan



Accepted projects

Total = **213.000 Euros**

- People Powered DDA - *Public Money, Open Software* (15k)
- Metagov Interoperable tools - *CSV interoperable exports/imports for participatory objects like on Decidim* (30k)
- BSC VCity Project - *API and Open data enhancements* (50k - 2 years)
- MultiPoD (EU Project) - *Political participation in multilingual spaces* (100k - 3 years)
- NGI Zero Commons Fund - *Decidim Revamp* (18k)



Challenges and learnings

Funding FLOSS

1. From a local-based project to an global community
2. Receive grants from public organisations from other countries.
3. How do we finance maintenance work?
4. Submit projects that do not divert you from your core mission.
5. We need to internationalize our legal and financial structure
